

1. Animal Magic

A duo of locally crafted sculptures, comprising of a horse and a dog, constructed from steel bars with the location chosen as a nod to the close proximity of animal welfare facilities including Louth County Council's Animal Compound and Dundalk Dog Rescue.

2. Souterrain

This replica souterrain was commissioned to mark the excavation of the ringfort settlement discovered by archaeologists during construction of the M1 Dundalk/Dunleer Motorway in 2000.

3. Slip Slidin' Away

This child friendly public art feature is a tribute to the Class of 2020 whose primary school journey ended without warning with the arrival of Covid 19.

4. Boy Reading

Installed in 2016 this sculptural piece serves as a permanent symbol of the close working relationship between Dromiskin Tidy Towns and St. Peter's N.S. and marks the 40th anniversary of the opening of the school building.

5. Remembering 1916

Located in the School Grounds this commemorative piece of public art is constructed from the metal of recycled school chairs and, at its base, represents the pillars of the GPO surrounded by barricades, and is locked in a stone base replicating the cobbled streets of Dublin in 1916.

6. Heritage Park

Hosting many interpretations the Heritage Park is home to a sculpture of the induction coil credited to Fr Nicholas Callan from the Parish of Darver / Dromiskin as well as artefacts representing our Railway Heritage.

7. Reading With Eyes Open

The latest addition to Dromiskin's sculptures is located at the Outdoor Libraries where it draws attention to the benefits of reading and the options that exist for sustainable reading.

8. I Come in Peace

Nestled in Lawlor's Peace Garden, to the backdrop of the monastic site, this Viking image crafted from bog oak is a lasting tribute to those who settled in Dromiskin, forging peace and contributing to the community.

9. Birds Eye View

Crafted from bog oak this locally crafted sculpture stands proudly in the Medieval Garden and its design gives a nod to a local legend involving Viking raids and preserving it in the imagination of generations to come.

10. Ring a Rosy

The very first sculpture installed in Dromiskin, Ring a Rosy evokes happy memories of childhood games in simpler times.

11. Connecting Communities

Located in the Credit Union Garden this contemporary sculpture symbolises the close relationship between two community organisations - the Tidy Towns group and the Credit Union recognising the ethos of co-operation and sharing of resources for the greater community good.

12. Ogham Stone

Standing as a centrepiece within the Dreamtime Garden the Ogham Stone is inscribed with the word "care" - a fitting symbol to Tidy Towns volunteers whose motto is Caring for our Environment.

13. Viking Boat

A key feature on Dromiskin's Heritage Trail this striking sculpture defines the village centre and serves as a strong visual reminder of our Viking heritage.
